President Cooper received a warm welcome from the group assembled.

- Giving is up 33%, which reflects pledges from Alumni members.
- Second Phase Construction –
 - Library Archives - to be completed in 24 months
 - Computer Science Building – to be started in January, 2011
 - Hodge Hall – to be named after Former President, Leroy Davis, dedication to take place in February
- Dec 11 – Winter graduation, speaker Rick Wade, Dept of Transportation
- May graduation speaker – Gen Colin Powell

- Honors College – 250 students are enrolled. Program is offered to sophomores and juniors. Most are Presidential Scholars, with fees paid by the University.
- A Technology firm is looking at our networking system to improve how business is being done. Some streamlining is taking place at the present.
- University received 1.2 million dollars from Orangeburg County
- Chestnut Street entrance – the road is not paved, but between now and mid January work will be done. This will improve the looks of the campus and will provide safe access to University Village.
- The University is working on enrollment for the second semester.
 - Real Challenge: financial assistance for student scholarship and other needs.
 - Financial support from Alums is deeply appreciated.
